EMBLEM. Description. Per bend azure and gules, between a bend or, charged with a chain of seven links in bend of the first, a lightning bolt of the third in chief, and two olive branches in saltire proper, in base. Significance. The upper left half of the shield is blue and stands for honor. The lower right half of the shield is red and stands for valor. The yellow band separating the blue and red fields stands for faith in God. The bolt of lightning is symbolic of the readiness to support the Air Force mission. The olive branches represent the common desire of Peace through strength. The length of chain represents the combined strength of all group units. Motto. THE POWER BEHIND THE POWER. Approved on 11 Aug 1954. (Neg. 151102 A.C.)
